



Christine Ockrent is regarded as one of France's most respected broadcasters, the only journalist granted an interview with Saddam Hussein in the middle of the Gulf War. As well as becoming the first woman to edit the prime time news, Christine has also edited the current affairs journal L'Express, worked as the Deputy Director-General of France's TFI channel and presented the country's flagship magazine and arts show, "France-Europe Express".

With a wealth of national and international experience in broadcasting and journalism, Christine is an excellent communicator. With an astute insight into the effects of global economics and politics she is able to use her experience to influence decision makers in corporate organisations.

Graduate of the Institute of Political Studies in Paris, Christine Ockrent began her journalistic career in the American chains of TV NBC News and CBS News. She worked for 8 years at CBS's 60 Minutes.

For her work in TV and journalism, Christine has been awarded several French and International distinctions. Author of several books, Christine is Chevalier of the Legion of Honour and is a member on the Board of Directors of Reporters without Borders, as well as the International Crisis Group.
